If you spend £4 on Monday, how much do you have left for the rest of the week?

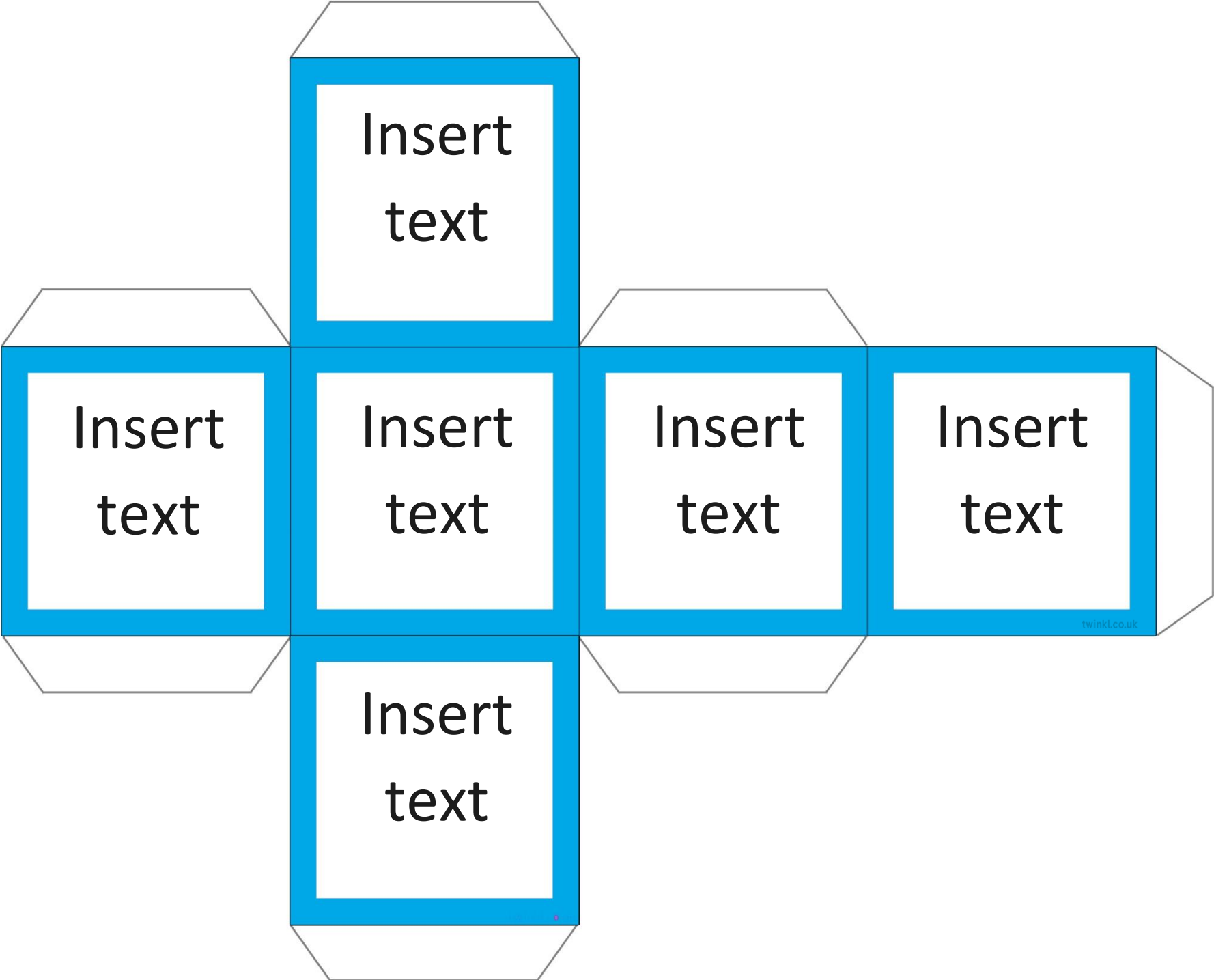
There is an x-box game that you would really like. It costs £45. You have £19.65 in your bank account. How much more will you need to save before you can afford the game?

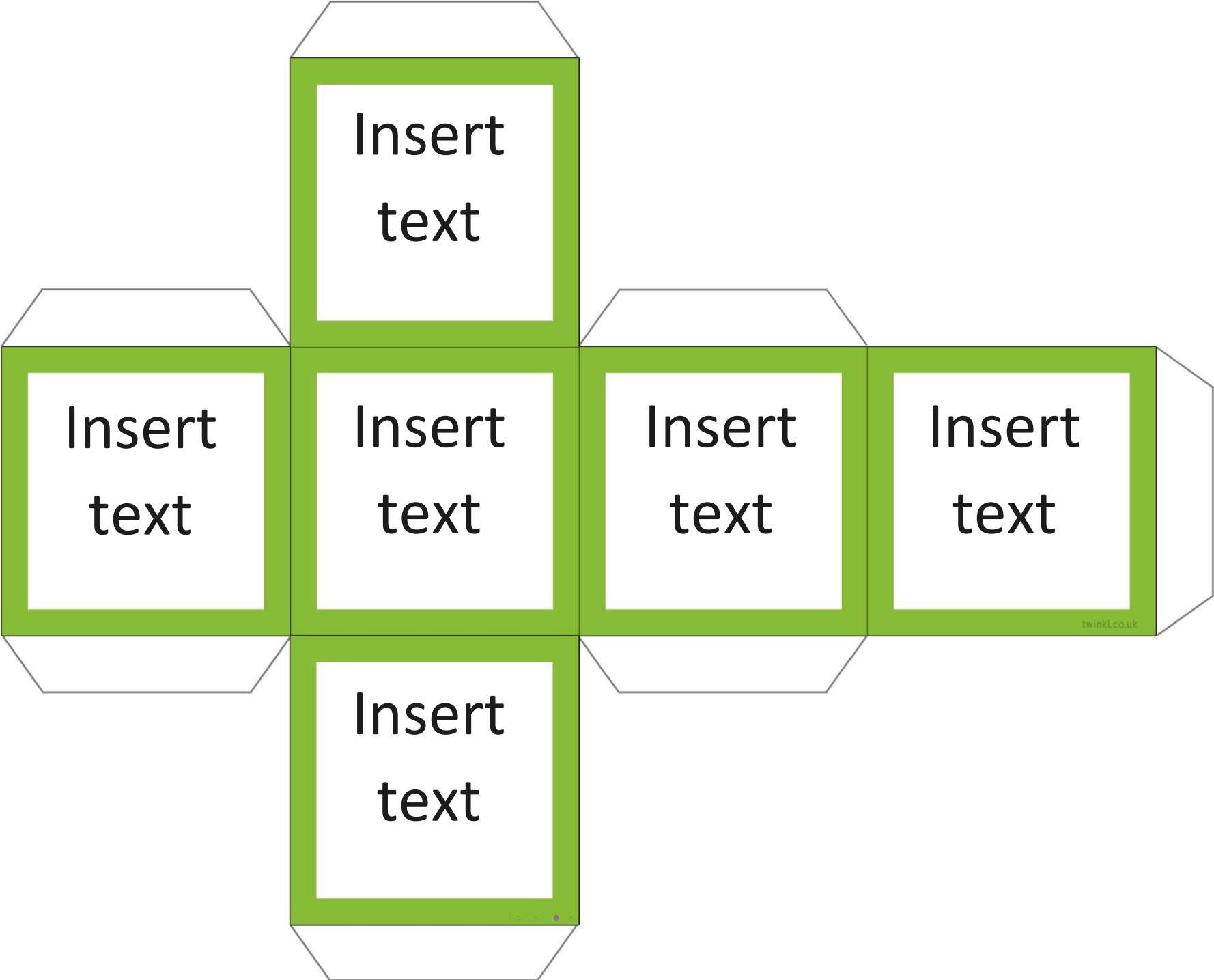

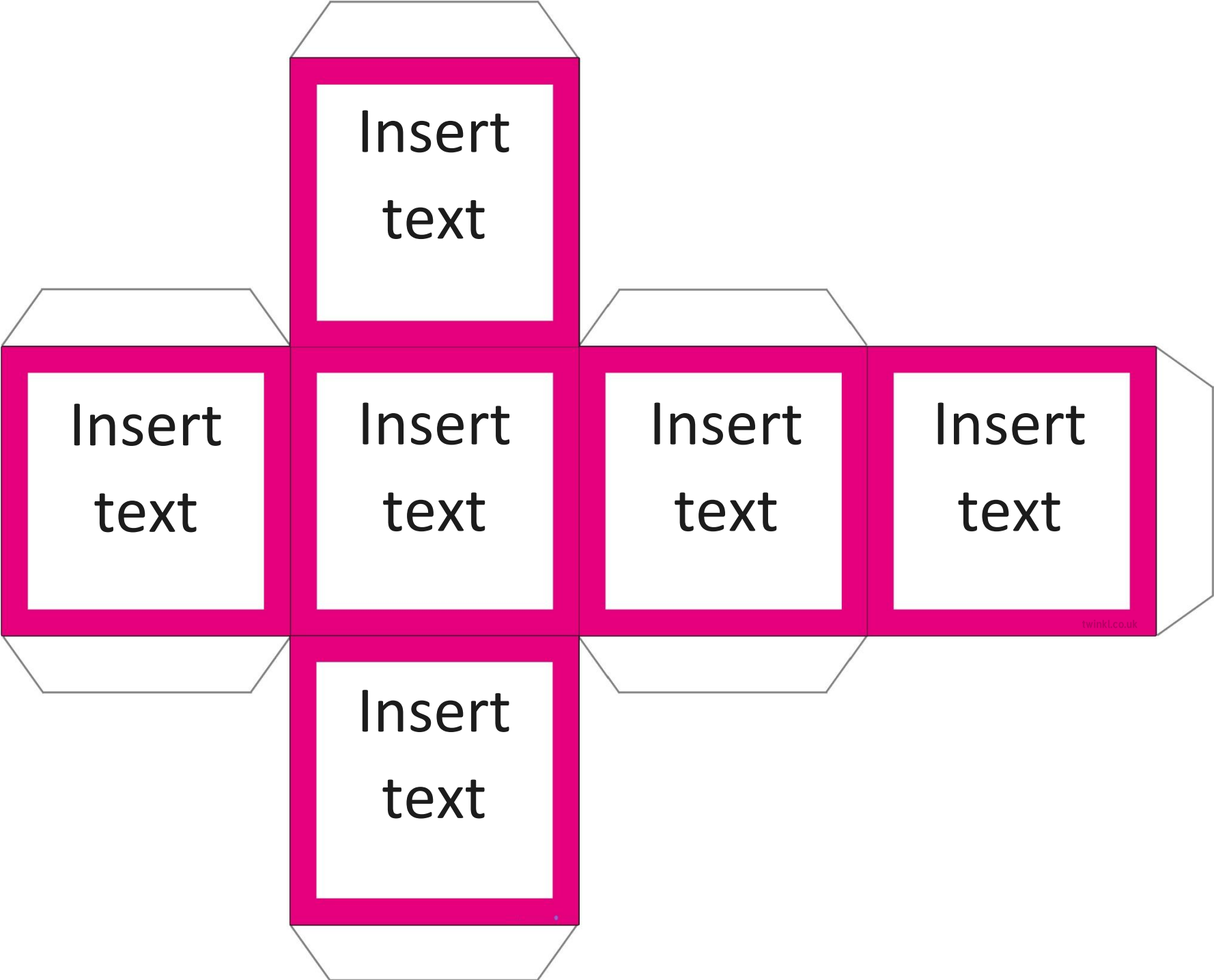
